



Itinerary Naples - Naples

Day 1 - Naples to Ischia (2h30m cruising)

Embark at 12.00p.m. in Marina d'Arechi. Welcome on board and meet our crew. After familiarizing with our Satori Yacht we will start sailing to the small island of Procida where you will enjoy a tasty welcome lunch. This island is definitely the pearl of the Neapolitan islands and owes its name to the verb "prochyo", which means "erupted". It was probably formed by the eruptions of volcanoes that are unactive nowadays. The vertical coast is made of tufa stone, but the inland presents many cultivations and gardens. The maritime and terrestrial environment are perfectly integrated and create a unique and marvelous blend. The main port of the island is Marina di Procida, a fishermen village, south of the Island is the Corricella, a fishermen's harbor, where the famous movie by Massimo Troisi, "Il Postino" was shot and Chiaiolella, lovely fishermen's village, with its pink and yellow little houses. After lunch we will sail to Ischia. Overnight

Day 2 – Ischia

Start the day with breakfast aboard Satori. Ischia is the biggest of the Phlegraean Islands, and is surmounted by Mount Epomeo. The island is famous for its thermal springs and is characterized by a rich, luxurious vegetation, covering not only the cultivated areas (vineyards) but also the little rocks and the stones, forming the typical "green tufa". The main port serves as the entrance to the city that extends itself all the way to the Aragonese Castle, dating back to the V century b.C. Other harbours are: Casamicciola, Florio d'Ischia and S. Angelo. This last one is built on the East side of a stretch of sand linking Punta S.

Angelo with the mainland and is one of the most picturesque corners of the island with its unaltered nature. Our Captain will circumnavigate Ischia but we can also organize many activities on the island you can enjoy. You will love the calm bays, “off the beaten” tracks. Overnight in Ischia.

Day 3 - Ischia to Palmarola and Ponza (5h sailing)

After breakfast we will start sailing to Palmarola Island, the most western island of the Pontine Archipelago. We suggest you visit Punta Tramontana, from where you can admire a very beautiful bay called "The Cathedral" because of its cliff falling vertically to the sea and the big bays remind of that image. Lunch, relax and enjoy swimming in beautiful turquoise waters. In the afternoon start sailing to Ponza, the whole island is fringed by inlets and coves. Discover Cala Inferno , Ansa dello Schiavone, Cala di Feola e Cala dell'Acqua Here you will find the natural pools, excavated by the sea in the tufa stone. Cala di Lucia Rosa: this coastline is particularly beautiful and is characterized by a series of grottoes and rocks. Chiaia di Luna: from this marvelous beach you can reach the town of Ponza walking through a tunnel excavated by the ancient Romans. Ponza is a true jewel and you can also enjoy a lovely dinner in one of the most known restaurants. Overnight in a peaceful bay.

Day 4 – Ponza Island to Ventotene Island (2h30m sailing)

After breakfast, we will sail to the island of Ventotene. The old harbor, Porto Nicola, has been excavated by the ancient Romans, as well as the bollards and the portico running along the quay, still perfectly functioning and the ancient Roman fish pond for fish raising, provided with an ingenious system for water recycling through pipes flowing into two covered pools flowing into two covered pools. The island saves other historical vestiges among which the remains of a great roman construction towards Punta Eolo: the Borbonic stairway and the fortress. Lunch and relax and enjoy swimming in the natural marine reserve: Cala Parata Grande, Cala Nave and Parata della Postina zone of the natural

marine reserve. Sail in the afternoon to the nearby Island of Santo Stefano, a big rock of a couple of kilometers from the perimeter, where the only building is a prison (of the form circular) and the journey continues towards Zannone. Overnight

Day 5 – Ventotene Island to Capri (4h sailing)

You will decide with our Captain if staying still in this paradise for half of the day or after breakfast sail to Capri. Arriving in Capri you will discover Cala di Maternania, Cala Ventroso, the White Grotto, the Green Grotto and the most famous Blue Grotto. Enjoy the swim and relax and a lovely lunch. You can't miss a nice a glamorous aperitivo at the internationally known Piazzetta di Capri (the main square). Dinner and overnight

Day 6 – Capri to Amalfi (1h sailing)

After breakfast, we will sail towards the Amalfi coast: Positano, Priano, and Amalfi itself. Positano is one of the most aesthetic towns in the Mediterranean. The buildings clamber up the green mountain side away from the beach, climbing high and impressively above the sea level. A World Heritage Site and the main town of given coastline. Amalfi will be your home for the night

Day 7 – Amalfi

Amalfi has had a glorious history as a maritime republic. The hub of the historic center is Piazza del Duomo, in front of the dramatic 11th century St. Andrew's cathedral with its Arab-influenced facade. The piazza is clustered with outdoor cafes and exclusive boutiques – perfect for whiling away a few hours after you've admired the stunning Baroque interior of the cathedral, decorated with bronzes and mosaics. Also you will have the chance to visit stunning Ravello . perched high above the sapphire blue sea, is undoubtedly one of the Amalfi coast's highlights. Its breath-taking views, beautiful formal gardens, peaceful atmosphere and glamorous history. Ravello has long attracted the literary, artistic, and show-business elites, with Wagner (who was inspired to write the opera Parsifal by the

views), DH Lawrence, E M Forster, MC Escher, Truman Capote, Tennessee Williams, Virginia Woolf, Greta Garbo and Gore Vidal – who lived here for 30 years – just some of the famous names seduced by Ravello's beauty. The central square – the Piazza Duomo – is the heart of the town's activity with beautifully appointed spots for a glass of wine or a coffee, the attractive sixteenth century facade cathedral and the rambling Villa Rufolo, whose gorgeous gardens, designed in the 1850s at the height of the Grand Tour era, offer vast, panoramic views over the coast.

Sorrento, a town located idyllically on a peninsula with views of the Bay of Naples and the towering volcano Vesuvius. The tapestry like backdrop that greets you as Vesuvius rises on the horizon is a fantastic place to have one last run out on your favourite water toy, be it the jetski or a ride in a donut. The home of limoncello, disembarking and grabbing a bottle or two to take home is a necessity. Overnight in Sorrento.

Day 8 - Sorrento to Naples to disembark by 12noon (40m cruising)

After enjoying breakfast aboard Satori in beautiful Sorrento, we will sail to Marina d'Arechi for disembarking
