



Itinerary Dubrovnik - Šibenik

Day 1 - Dubrovnik to Crkvina Island (2h cruising)

Embark in Dubrovnik Port and Crew welcome guests aboard. Hence we will sail to Dubrovnik old town (1 hour) where you can enjoy a welcome lunch aboard Satori. Tour of the Old Town before sailing to Crkvina Island for evening and overnight.

Day 2 - Crkvina Island to Miljet National Park (4h sailing)

We will departure after breakfast towards Miljet, where we will serve lunch and guests can enjoy watersports afterwards. Miljet is a magnificent island that exhibits all the generosity of nature with its pistachio green pines, dark green cypresses and Aleppo pines, turquoise colored ponds, azure blue sea and sparkling bays. The island offers absolute silence and peace in the midst of all the beauties of nature. When you immerse yourself in the cool but warm waters that are suitable for swimming for hours, the pungent fresh scent of pine resins and the endless symphony of crickets accompany you. Guests can also rent scooters or bikes to visit the lake and enjoy the natural beauty on the west side of the Island. Overnight.

Day 3 - Miljet National Park to Korcula Island (4h cruising)

Korcula Island was ruled by the Venetians between the 10th and 18th centuries. When the Mediterranean was in an important position, the Venetians took Korcula as their base to control the Adriatic Sea. In this process, the castle and fortifications were built on the ancient Greek ruins. Especially in Korcula, which was at its best between the 13th and 15th centuries, unique palaces and churches of the period were also built. Visit of the Old Town after lunch. Relax the afternoon away and dinner in Gubavac Island, a small islet in Korcula archipelago. Overnight.

Day 4 - Korcula Island to Vis Island (4h cruising)

You will enjoy breakfast onboard Satori while sailing to Vis Island. Vis is a small Croatian island in the Adriatic Sea. It is the most remote inhabited island on the Croatian mainland. Before the end of the First World War, the island was held by the Liburnians, the Republic of Venice, the Napoleonic Kingdom of Italy and the Austrian Empire.

Guests can also decide to enjoy lunch on quite and turquoise waters Smokova Bay. Aperitivo time, you can visit the village of Vis before dinner is served on Satori. Overnight in Vis.

Day 5 – Vis Island to Hvar Island (2h30m cruising)

For a long time, Hvar has been one of the most famous island in Croatia. According to the studies, there are many valuable excavation sites on the island of Hvar, where life lasted an average of 4000 years ago. Hvar Island was under the rule of the Venetian Empire for a long time. In 1990, it was declared as a free region of Croatia.

Guests can enjoy lunch, swimming and water toys in Hvar. Visit of Hvar's old town in late afternoon/evening along its beautiful stone houses and streets before aperitivo and dinner. Overnight.

Day 6 - Hvar Island to Split and Primošten (4h30m sailing)

In the morning we will cruise from Hvar to Split and lunch will be served on Kasjuni Bay, west of Split Old Town.

Split features marvelous museums. One of the most popular is the Ethnographic Museum, where everything from jewellery to pottery is exhibited, showing how the people of Split lived in the past. All around the 1700-year-old city you can see the remains of walls and temples from the Roman Empire. The heart of the city is Diocletian's Palace in the center. It is on the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage list. Built in the early 4th century for Emperor Diocletian, the palace complex is a must-visit. You should definitely see Peristil Square, surrounded by Roman buildings around Diocletian's Palace. Don't forget to visit the Cathedral of St Duje, where Diocletian's mausoleum is located. This building, whose main structure dates back to 350 AD, is one of the oldest cathedrals in the world.

Late afternoon sail to Primošten (2h30m cruising) where guests could enjoy trekking or aperitivo at sunset before dinner. Overnight.

Day 7 - Primošten to Oštrica Bedem and Šibenik (3h cruising)

After guests enjoy breakfast on Satori, we will sail up to front of the Castle's walls in Oštrica Bedem (1h30m) where guests can enjoy a visit to this ancient area. Bedem instead is a waiveless bay perfect for water toys.

We will cruise to Šibenik in the afternoon. The old town of Šibenik is in the bay and can be navigated through a narrow sea canal by obtaining a navigation permit. As an alternative option, we will anchor in a quiet bay outside the Šibenik bay. The most distinctive features of Šibenik are definitely its historical buildings. The city features numerous historical beauties. Founded in the 11th century, Šibenik has a diverse artistic structure as it has been under many different civilizations. Especially St Michael's Castle that is one of the first to come to mind among the buildings from the Middle Ages.

The castle was the defense center of Sibenik, which was invaded countless times over the years. Today, it is among the most interesting buildings in the city due to its location and being a living history. Sibenik Cathedral is also one of the buildings that fascinates. Built in the 15th century, the cathedral is recognized as one of the most important historical buildings in Croatia and part of the UNESCO World Heritage List. Overnight.

Day 8 - Sibenik to Marina Mandalina (30m cruising)

Guests can have a relaxed morning and breakfast before sailing to Marina Mandalina for disembarkation latest 12:00 p.m.
