



## Itinerary Dubrovnik - Zadar

### **Day 1 - Dubrovnik to Jakljan Island (2h30m cruising)**

Embark in Dubrovnik. Enjoy the welcome lunch aboard Satori. Tour of the Old Town before sailing to quite Jakljan Island for dinner. Overnight.

### **Day 2 - Jakljan Island to Miljet National Park (2h30m sailing)**

We will departure after breakfast towards Sobra Bay in the heart of Miljet, where we will serve lunch and guests can enjoy watersports afterwards. Miljet is a magnificent island that exhibits all the generosity of nature with its pistachio green pines, dark green cypresses and Aleppo pines, turquoise colored ponds, azure blue sea and sparkling bays. The island offers absolute silence and peace in the midst of all the beauties of nature. When you immerse yourself in the cool but warm waters that are suitable for swimming for hours, the pungent fresh scent of pine resins and the endless symphony of crickets accompany you. Overnight.

### **Day 3 - Miljet National Park to Korcula Island (3h cruising)**

Korcula Island was ruled by the Venetians between the 10th and 18th centuries. When the Mediterranean was in an important position, the Venetians took Korcula as their base to control the Adriatic Sea. In this process, the castle and fortifications were built on the ancient Greek ruins. Especially in Korcula, which was at its best between the 13th and 15th centuries, unique palaces and churches of the period were also built. Visit of the Old Town after lunch. Relax the afternoon away and dinner in Gubavac Island, a small islet in Korcula archipelago. Overnight.

### **Day 4 - Korcula Island to Vis Island (4h cruising)**

You will enjoy breakfast onboard Satori while sailing to Vis Island. Vis is a small Croatian island in the Adriatic Sea. It is the most remote inhabited island on the Croatian mainland. Before the end of the First World War, the island was held by the Liburnians, the Republic of Venice, the Napoleonic Kingdom of Italy and the Austrian Empire.

### **Day 5 – Vis Island to Hvar Island (2h cruising)**

For a long time, Hvar has been one of the most famous island in Croatia. According to the studies, there are many valuable excavation sites on the island of Hvar, where life lasted an average of 4000 years ago. Hvar Island was under the rule of the Venetian Empire for a long

time. In 1990, it was declared as a free region of Croatia.

We will sail after breakfast and during the day we will anchor on the island of Marinkovac for water sports and activities.

Visit of Hvar's old town in late afternoon before enjoying dinner aboard Satori. Overnight.

### **Day 6 - Hvar Island to Split Solta or Drvenik Island (3h sailing)**

There are marvellous museums in the city. One of the most popular is the Ethnographic Museum, where everything from jewellery to pottery is exhibited, showing how the people of Split lived in the past. All around the 1700-year-old city you can see the remains of walls and temples from the Roman Empire. The heart of the city is Diocletian's Palace in the center. It is on the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage list. Built in the early 4th century for Emperor Diocletian, the palace complex is a must-visit. You should definitely see Peristil Square, surrounded by Roman buildings around Diocletian's Palace. Don't forget to visit the Cathedral of St Duje, where Diocletian's mausoleum is located. This building, whose main structure dates back to 350 AD, is one of the oldest cathedrals in the world. Overnight in Split, Solta or Drvenik.

### **Day 7 - Split to Šibenik (3h cruising)**

The old town of Šibenik is in the bay and can be navigated through a narrow sea canal by obtaining a navigation permit. As an alternative option, we will anchor in a quiet bay outside the Šibenik bay. The most distinctive features of Šibenik are definitely its historical buildings. The city features numerous historical beauties. Founded in the 11th century, Šibenik has a diverse artistic structure as it has been under many different civilizations. Especially St Michael's Castle that is one of the first to come to mind among the buildings from the Middle Ages. The castle was the defense center of Šibenik, which was invaded countless times over the years. Today, it is among the most interesting buildings in the city due to its location and being a living history. Šibenik Cathedral is also one of the buildings that fascinates. Built in the 15th century, the cathedral is recognized as one of the most important historical buildings in Croatia and part of the UNESCO World Heritage List.

### **Day 8 - Šibenik to Zirje Island (2h cruising)**

Zirje is the largest island in the Šibenik archipelago. Zirje is known for its natural beauty, crystal clear waters, and several valuable monuments such as the parish church of St. Mary, a fort from the 6th century on the locality of Gradina, as well as a five-room building "Stari stan". You can visit the National Park Kornati, Krka National Park, as well as the cultural and historical center of the region. Sports lovers can enjoy cycling (Zirje has a very nice trail), hiking and various water sports.

### **Day 9 – Zirje Island to Kornati National Park (3h sailing)**

Kornati National Park is called a "nautical paradise" thanks to its incomparable and unique beauty. National Park Kornati is an archipelago of 89 gorgeous islands, islets, and reefs in the northern part of Dalmatia, near Dugi Otok, Pašman, Murter, Zadar, and Šibenik. Overnight in Kornati Island.

**Day 10 – Kornati Island to Ugljan Island (2h30m cruising)**

After enjoying breakfast aboard Satori, we will cruise towards the old harbor Zadar where there are three different bays to relax, enjoying swimming and water sports. Overnight in Ugljan Island.

**Day 11 – Disembark in Zadar by 12noon**

Guests can enjoy breakfast and a morning swim before cruising to the old harbor of Zadar for disembarkation.
